Farnborough

We have been a church family since establishing in 2013 and have a lively family feel, where people of all ages and backgrounds are welcome in our community. Our building was once a soft play centre where families would come and have fun, and we want our church gatherings to be places full of joy, and full of the love of God.

small groups



Joining a small group is a great way of getting to know people and exploring faith. We love seeing people who come to church on a Sunday, meet up during the week with others to share their lives and learn together.

We have a huge range of small groups available for people to join across all of our sites, as well as online. Some groups are interest-based, bringing together people who share a love of running, books or coffee. Other groups meet together to discuss the Sunday preach or work through a course.



Saskia and Andrew are part of a small group which recently completed the Emotionally Healthy Spirituality Course, which looks at topics including your family traditions, processing grief and loss, and establishing healthy daily rhythms.



Each week we'd meet together, and after prayer and a quick catchup we'd watch a video for about 20 minutes, then discuss some of that week's topic. Then everyone had a daily devotional guide to build on the weekly discussion. This led to learning that I need to pay more attention to what God is saying, instead of rushing through life. - Andrew

We were at a stressful time in our lives. We'd just moved over from South Africa, and this course really brought up a whole load of things we didn't even realise were there. At home, we'd continue discussing things more deeply every day, so it was actually really cool because it would just open more of a conversation between Andrew and I as husband and wife. - Saskia

I enjoyed being able to mingle and meet new people and build relationships. Building relationships, having the consistency of a weekly meet-up was just excellent.


Theology Track

For children aged 0-11 our Kerith Kids groups meet on Sundays in a fun and safe environment for them to learn about and meet with Jesus – and make loads of friends! Depending on the age group there is a mix of free play, worship, games, puzzles, a short age-relevant bible teach, prayer and ministry time.

We love to create spaces where children can really enjoy coming to church as they explore their own faith journey and have a dedicated team of safely recruited kids team volunteers.

We are passionate that all children feel welcomed at all our sites and are growing our Kids+ teams who focus on one-to-one support for children with additional needs.

We also love to run seasonal events for children and families, such as Easter fun days and Light Parties over Halloween - we'd love to see you to any of our gatherings sometime soon!

Meet Sasha

How did you get involved in working with kids at church?

We were encouraged to join a ministry team during a service a few years ago, I was drawn to both the Welcome and the Kids team. We've not been blessed with children of our own, so after much reflecting and prayer, I ticked the Kids Team box and got started!



I serve in the group for children age five to nine. We arrive an hour before, set up the room and pray. We have a brilliant team! After the kids register, there's time for free play, we start the session with welcome and a game. During the worship we often do actions and sign language to get everyone involved – this is one of my favourite parts. We then do the teaching before going into small groups, have a snack, discuss the teaching, do a craft, and pray together.

What's your favourite thing about working with children at church?

When the children ask Jesus to be their 'forever friend' by saying their ABC prayer. Wow! Also, working with a fantastic team of volunteers, and getting involved in Kerith Kids TV, our online videos for kids of all ages. I loved being a part of that during the pandemic.

Revive is our social justice ministry, and is an integral part of Kerith. Our services focus on key needs including debt and money management, life skills, food poverty, befriending and

mentoring and others. Our projects are varied, offering a range of services to support, encourage, and empower people across our sites in Bracknell Forest, Farnborough, Windsor and West Wight.

Liz worked in a housing project run by one of Kerith's partnerships Renova House. She bought along a number of the tenants to a CAP Money course run by the Revive team. Liz had wanted them to learn budgeting skills to prepare for independent living but hadn't expected to get a grip on her own finances. "I had my head in the sand, only just staying afloat" she says. Seeing her own budget in black and white helped her manage a plan and begin saving.

Ollie appreciated the common-sense ideas, and practical suggestions on how to cut back and make ends meet - good basics for the future. The friendly, non-judgmental atmosphere really helped and built trust in the group, as stress over money is often kept private.

It was interesting, the team took time to get to know us all and our situations.

Ollie has also enjoyed coming to church on Sundays and for Liz, the help the tenants get from Kerith has been massive, giving them opportunities to volunteer, no matter their faith background, helping them towards getting their lives on track.

We enjoy leading a group at Kerith West Wight because it is exciting and encouraging getting to know different people, hearing their stories and seeing friendships grow as we share our faith together.


Foodbank: Chris

Our Foodbank serves people in our local community that are going through tough times. There are a number of different roles within Foodbank, both behind the scenes and working with guests directly.

Sometimes when a new client first arrives, they can be defensive and anxious. Experiences from the past and how life has treated them so far might have led them to be like that.

But when they leave, we often see them smiling with a renewed hope that there are people who care, and with some dignity restored.

I've enjoyed working at Foodbank and know I have grown in confidence talking with and praying with clients and volunteers. I know God wants me being part of the team here at Foodbank.





EXPLORELIFE FAITH JESUS

At the core of Kerith is a passion to help people explore what it looks like to have faith. Although the statistics say a huge percentage of people think about spiritual matters, or even pray, it's often hard to find the right time and place to ask the questions you have.

Rich started exploring faith during lockdown

I've always been a truth hunter and during lockdown there was nothing else to do but look into things more. The one thing that made me think the most was a guy on the internet that talked about how science and the Bible weren't necessarily in conflict. I was fascinated in how this could be.

Rich knew a neighbour opposite was a Christian and he started wandering over to ask him questions.

When I got stumped I'd go over and ask him, I was asking him all these technical questions! Finally he invited me to join him one Sunday at Kerith. Walking into church it was so surprisingly welcoming- not what I was expecting!

I was invited to join in on the Alpha course to ask my questions, and each week the subject was so helpful in answering questions I hadn't even thought of asking! We ate and chatted together as a group each week and I met some great people.

At the end of the course I knew that I had found what I was looking for. Now I have a new perspective knowing that I have been set free from my past and I have a purpose for my future. That Jesus was who he said He was. I'm still learning loads as I keep walking out my new faith, Kerith is a great place to meet others who can help answer questions I still have.

Rich's advice for people anyone exploring faith is to find people to ask, don't go down crazy internet search dead ends- come and ask or join an Alpha course in his words:





So - what's stopping you from going on this journey? Maybe it's scary - but if you're one of the thousands of people who think about spiritual things but haven't ever asked the questions out loud, maybe now it the time to start.

We recommend three great next steps:

- Talk to a friend who you know has faith. Be brave and ask them the big questions!
- 2. Find an Alpha course you can either come along to a Kerith course or look online for one that suits your life.
- Come along to a Kerith Sunday meeting online or at one of our sites you can sit at the back and just observe it's great to see what it looks like to have faith in Jesus.
