WHY BAPTISM? JESUS DID IT!

At that time Jesus came from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to the place where John was. John baptised Jesus in the Jordan River. When Jesus was coming up out of the water, He saw heaven open. The Holy Spirit came down on Him like a dove. A voice came from heaven and said: "You are my Son and I love you. I am very pleased with you." Mark 1:9-11

WHY BAPTISM? JESUS SAID HIS DISCIPLES SHOULD DO IT.

After Jesus had died and rose again, He spent time meeting people, proving that He was alive again and preparing them as He was going to return to Heaven. Jesus wasn't going to leave them on their own, He promised the Holy Spirit would be with them. The day finally came for Jesus to return to Heaven. His last words were important.

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. And teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age" Matthew 28: 18-20

Jesus was telling His disciples to help others to know and follow Him and then baptise them.

WHY OF SHOWING THAT


IT'S A WAY OF SHOWING THAT WE ARE TAKING OUR PLACE IN GOD'S FAMILY.

WHY OF SHOWING ON THE

IT'S A WAY OF SHOWING ON THE OUTSIDE WHAT IS HAPPENING ON THE INSIDE.

Sometimes it's hard to find words to describe to others what is happening in our thinking, in our hearts and in our spirit.


When God is at work in us - what He often does is hard to describe with words. Sometimes the things we do (outside) helps others to see what God is doing in our thinking, hearts and spirit (inside). Baptism is a way to show outside, what is happening inside.

What is happening inside that we want to show?

We show that Jesus has helped us to repent. Repenting means to 'turn around'. We turn around - away from sin and towards Jesus. As we step into the waters we are showing that our sin is 'washed away' by Jesus.

We show that because of Jesus, we are leaving our old life (without Jesus) behind and beginning a new life (with Jesus) Our new life lasts forever. In baptism, as we go under the water, we are dying to our old life, and when we come up out of the water we are rising to our new life.

"Or don't you know that all of us who were baptised into Christ Jesus were baptised into His death? We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life" - Romans 6: 3-4


